



CAMPING SINGLES TRIP GUIDELINES

Please be considerate, respectful, and cooperative toward the Trip Coordinator and other trip participants at all times. Familiarize yourself with and follow all Forest Service, State Parks and Campground Rules and Regulations.

1. Reservations, when required, are made by the trip coordinator only for those who have paid for a whole or half site. If you pay for a half site you will be sharing it with someone else. Specific campsites are first-come, first-serve. However, some sites may be saved for larger motor homes, and people who arrive later may be assigned to a site due to limited spaces left. If you need a handicap site, or have other special needs, please notify the trip coordinator.
2. Please inform the trip coordinator in advance of all changes: for example, in camping equipment, if you will arrive late, or if you want to bring a guest (to make sure there is enough space)
3. Guests are welcome and may attend one trip before deciding whether to join the club. All guests, including children and other relatives of members, **must be over the age of 18.**
4. **If you need to cancel**, please be considerate of people on the waiting list and notify the trip coordinator as soon as you know, so that someone else can buy your site.
5. The total cost of the campsite, including any extra vehicle fee, is to be shared equally by the total number of people occupying the site.
6. You are responsible for your own transportation. You may go alone, caravan, or carpool. We recommend that you carpool only with people whom you know.
7. There is usually a potluck breakfast and dinner on Saturday on 2-day trips, and 2 breakfasts and dinners on 3-day trips. **These activities are optional.** If you choose to participate, you need to bring a potluck dish and your own plate, utensils and beverage. Meals begin promptly at the designated time – as a general rule, 8:30 am for breakfast, and 6:00 pm for dinner, subject to change.
8. Please do your share to keep the community area clean by removing personal items when finished. Put trash in the trash bag, recyclable items in the recycling bag, and paper in the fire pit. You are responsible for leaving your own campsite clean.
9. **Pets** must be kept under the control of their owners, on a short leash attached to something, and in their owner's campsite, **away from the food**, during community meals.
10. We have campfires almost every evening in designated fire pits. **Please bring some wood** and a lawn chair.
11. **Please be considerate of others.** Excessive noise, such as power tools, racing motors, lengthy use of generators, shouting, foul language, barking dogs, and loud music, disturbs others enjoyment of the camping experience. Please respect the campground quiet hours – usually 10:00 pm to 6:00 am.
12. If you leave the campground early and are not coming back, please inform the trip coordinator so that they will not worry or send anyone to search for you.
